THINKING OF HOME

The burst of sun in the western sky and the eagle in flight symbolizes the "Spread Eagle Platform" on which James K. Polk ran for and was elected to the Presidency in 1844. President Polk sought and achieved territorial expansion to the country's natural western borders. This vast area, as we know it now, encompasses nine western states of the Union.

The four stars represent the four major land areas acquired during President Polk's term of office:

- California Territory
- New Mexico Territory
- Texas Statehood
- Oregon Territory


The field of blue stands for the unity of purpose that Polk strived so hard for among the several states and territories.

The Blue field edged in gold reflects the foundation of a formal course of education and preparation for Naval Officers at the United States Naval Academy founded in 1845.

This week the choice of sidearm as back up gun will be discussed. There are different laws in every state concerning hunting with hand guns so before taking one on the hunt be sure to check the gun laws carefully.

My number one selection is the 357 magum with it's muzzel velocity of 1550 feet per second and 845 foot pounds of energy it does a neat job on most game. There is also a bonus in getting a 357 in that you have two guns in one, that is, the 357 will shoot 38 special also. This will save you money whyle learning the gun and prepare you for the bigger shell. With a variety of arms to select from you can get anything from jack-rabbit to bear.


Another good back-up gun is the 44 magnum, I mention this caliber due to the fact that many hunters have the 44 cal. rifel thus you only have to carry one type of ammo for both guns. The 44 magnum is rated at 1470 feet per second muzzle velocity, with 1,150 foot pounds of energy; so as you cansee this is a most effective pistol too.

I suggest the Smith & Wesson .357 Combat Magnum priced at \$135.00. This may seemed a little expensive but it is a handgun that will last a lifetime. Ruger makes both the 357 and 44 mag price under \$100.00. The selection should be made on the needs of the hunter and above all make sure the pistol meets t the minimum requirements of the state you are hunting.



JAMES K. POLK

James Knox Polk, for whom the USS James K. Polk(SSBN645) is named, was born to Samuel and Jane Knox Polk on November 2, 1795, in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina and eventually became the eleventh president of the United States. During his distinguished career he also was a U.S Congressman, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor of Tennessee.

During his younger years Polk was not in good health and only received a limited education because of the limited facilities in his pioneer community. However at age 18, he attended Murfreesborough Academy where his literary merit and moral worth won the approval of the rector and in 1815 he entered the University of North Carolina. Polk was graduated from the University in 1818 and enjoyed the distinction of being awarded first honors in both mathematics and the classics. Early in 1819 he began the study of law in the office of Judge Felix Grundy and was admitted to the bar in 1820. In 1823 he was chosen to represent his county in the state legislature and having thus entered the political arena, he continued in a very active manner, and for the most part successful political career to the close of his term of President(1845-1849)

As the youngest President up to that time, Polk had a distinguished record of accomplishments. The western border of the United States was pushed to the Pacific adding to this country what is now Texas, California, Oregon Arizona, Nevada, Utah, New Mexico, Washington, Idaho and parts of Montana, Wyoming and Colorado. He also settled the Oregon Boundary dispute with Great Britain, and established an independent Treasury system. By his assertion of the "POLK DOCTRINE" he made the American continent safe for democracy by repelling with all vigor interference by European Powers. Seldom in our history has such an ambitious program been carried into effect in the brief span of four years.

In spite of all this he remained relatively forgotten notwithstanding the fact that his tariff policy led to prosperity; that his treasury system proved successful; that his "POLK DOCTRINE" has been approved and extended; and his expansion policy added over five hundred thousand square miles of territory, and gave the United States the access of the Pacific Ocean.

During his administration a formal course of education and preparation for Naval Officers at the United States Naval Academy was founded in 1845.

Polk was truly a constructive and unusually able executive, and a sound patriot who "planted the laws of the American Union on the shores of the Pacific".
